MINUTES OF THE ANKENY CITY COUNCIL

Monday, November 18, 2019 5:30 PM Ankeny City Hall - City Council Chambers Gary Lorenz, Mayor Mark Holm, Mayor Pro tem

Council Members: Bobbi Bentz, Jim McKenna, Kelly Whiting, Kerry Walter-Ashby

Mayor Lorenz called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM. All Council Members were present. City Manager, David Jones and City Attorney, Amy Beattie were present. Mayor Lorenz led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC FORUM:

- 1. Sara Volkmann from the Ankeny Chamber of Commerce informed council of upcoming events and encouraged council to attend. Information can be found at Ankeny.org
- 2. Joey Beech, Ankeny Economic Development, thanked council and staff for attending the annual Salute to Industries.
- Marilyn Garvey, 309 NE Eaglewood Dr, Ankeny, representing the "Ankeny Flood Committee" through AMOS, asked council to consider applying to FEMA for the Community Rating System. City Council advised Ms. Garvey that the council had discussed this topic at the 10-21-19 council meeting and had agreed to re-visit this subject during the budget process.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

PUBLIC HEARING(S):

- PH 2019-64: Mayor Lorenz announced that this is the time and place for a public hearing on the matter of the acquisition of property and property interests for the public improvement to be known as SE Hulsizer Road Realignment project. Notice of this hearing was published in the Des Moines Register on the 1st day of November, 2019 and notices were mailed as required by law.
 - Mark Mueller, Public Works Director, reported that the action before the Council is to hold a Public Hearing to allow affected property owners the opportunity to present their views regarding the proposed acquisition of property and property interests for the SE Hulsizer Road Realignment project. Further action includes consideration of a Resolution approving the commencement of the public improvement including negotiations to facilitate the acquisition of fee title, permanent easements and temporary easements for the project.
 - Hearing no other comments and receiving no written correspondence, Council member Whiting moved, Walter-Ashby seconded, to close public hearing 2019-64. Ayes: 5.
- 2. PH 2019-65: Mayor Lorenz announced that this is the time and place for a public hearing on the matter of the adoption of plans, specifications, form of contract, and estimate of cost for construction of certain public improvements described in general as construction of the

Ankeny Public Services Library Remodel project. Notice of this hearing was published in the Des Moines Register on the 8th day of November 2019.

Paul Moritz, Assistant City Manager, reported that with the pending completion of the new Ankeny Kirkendall Public Library, the next phase of the city's overall facilities plan can commence: The remodeling of the existing Kirkendall library into the new Public Services Building. The scope of the project includes a full remodeling of the interior of the structure, and site improvements including new parking lot, access drive and turn lane. The interior of the building shall be demolished and rebuilt to accommodate our four public service departments. The construction work includes all civil, landscape, architectural, mechanical, electrical, and technology systems. The exterior of the building shall be maintained except for the front façade, which shall be reconstructed. A new parking lot will be constructed along with a new turn lane on NW Prairie Ridge Drive. A new geothermal HVAC system and emergency generator will be included.

Hearing no other comments and receiving no written correspondence, Council member Holm moved, Whiting seconded, to close public hearing 2019-65. Ayes: 5.

3. PH 2019-66: Mayor Lorenz announced that this is the time and place for a public hearing on the matter of a proposed Emergency Watershed Protection Easement. Notice of this hearing was published in the Des Moines Register on the 8th day of November, 2019.

Mark Mueller, Public Works Director, reported that in 2012, the City acquired property in the southwest quadrant of the East 1st Street & SE Frisk Drive intersection that is subject to an Emergency Watershed Protection Program Floodplain Warranty Easement Deed (Easement). The City requested that the Easement be removed from part of the property in order to facilitate construction of the improvements on East 1st Street that are included in the I-35 & East 1st Street Interchange Reconstruction project in 2019 and 2020. In exchange for the property removed from the Easement, a slightly greater area is being added to the Easement.

The City has provided the United States of America with the documentation required for approval of the new easement area. The United States of America now requests approval by the City Council in the form of a Resolution prior to forwarding all documentation to the General Counsel.

The City Council originally adopted this said Resolution on August 19, 2019 as Resolution 2019-359; however, the Title Guaranty attorney has requested that the City Council go through a public hearing on the approval of said Resolution.

Hearing no other comments and receiving no written correspondence, Council member Walter-Ashby moved, Holm seconded, to close public hearing 2019-66. Ayes: 5.
