#### MINUTES OF THE ANKENY CITY COUNCIL

Monday, April 20, 2020 5:30 PM
Ankeny Kirkendall Library - City Council Chambers

Mayor Lorenz called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM. Due to Covid-19 Pandemic all council members joined the meeting via conference call. City Manager, David Jones and City Attorney, Amy Beattie were also present.

### **PUBLIC FORUM**

 Daniel Manning, Sr., an attorney from Lillis O'Malley Olson Manning Pose Templeman LLP, addressed council on behalf of the Deer Creek, LLC Development. Manning filed a formal objection to item CA-32, a policy for developer cost sharing on proposed street crossings of existing named waterways. He requested that the item be removed from the consent agenda and that the proposed policy not be adopted by city council.

## **APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

1. Council member Whiting moved, second by Holm, to approve and accept the April 20, 2020 agenda, with the amendment of removing item CA-32, a policy for developer cost sharing on proposed street crossings of existing named waterways, from consent agenda and placing it on the agenda for separate discussion/action. Ayes: 5.

## **PUBLIC HEARING**

 PH 2020-26. Mayor Lorenz announced that this is the time and place for a public hearing on the matter of the acquisition of property and property interests for the public improvement to be known as West First Street Widening & Improvements – Phase 1 project. Notice of this hearing was published in the Des Moines Register on the 10th day of April, 2020 and notices were mailed as required by law.

Mark Mueller, Public Works Director, reported the action before the Council is to hold a Public Hearing to allow affected property owners the opportunity to present their views regarding the proposed acquisition of property and property interests for the West First Street Widening and Improvements - Phase 1 project. Further action includes consideration of a Resolution approving the commencement of the public improvement including negotiations to facilitate the acquisition of fee title, permanent easements, and temporary easements for the project.

Mayor Lorenz then asked for any public comment regarding the West First Street Widening & Improvements – Phase 1 project. JoAnn Barten, representing Jerald Barten, 102 SW Pleasant Street, Ankeny, Iowa, asked council if a feasibility study had been done to consider using only the north side of West First Street which is mostly government owned instead of taking from private taxpayers. Mark Mueller answered the questions

JoAnn presented. Hearing no further comments, Council Member Whiting moved to close public hearing 2020-26, Bentz seconded. Ayes: 5.

 PH 2020-27. Mayor Lorenz announced that this is the time and place for a public hearing on the matter of the adoption of plans, specifications, form of contract and estimate of cost for construction of certain public improvements described in general as construction of the 2020 PCC Street Patching Program. Notice of this hearing was published in the Des Moines Register on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of April 2020.

Mark Mueller, Public Works Director, reported that The 2020 PCC Street Patching Program project includes the full depth removal and replacement of PCC street pavement at the SE Trilein Drive and SE 10th Street intersection and along SW Country Club Lane south of West 1st Street.

Mayor Lorenz then asked for any public comment regarding the proposed 2020 PCC Street Patching Program. Hearing no comments, Council Member Holm moved to close public hearing 2020-27, Walter-Ashby seconded. Ayes: 5.

3. PH 2020-28. Mayor Lorenz announced that this is the time and place for a public hearing on the matter of the adoption of plans, specifications, form of contract and estimate of cost for construction of certain public improvements described in general as construction of the 2020 CIPP Lining Project. Notice of this hearing was published in the Des Moines Register on the 10th day of April 2020.

Don Clark, Director of Municipal Utilities, reported that this project includes cured in place pipe (CIPP) slip lining existing sanitary sewer collection mains in various neighborhoods within the City of Ankeny. The construction improvements include minor traffic control, establishing a Public Information and Notification Program, cleaning, video inspection, service and obstruction locating, establishing and executing a sewage bypassing plan, removing obstructions by trenchless methods, verifying all sanitary sewer service reconnections, cleanup and miscellaneous associated work necessary to complete the project.

Mayor Lorenz then asked for any public comment regarding the proposed 2020 CIPP Lining Project. Hearing no comments, Council Member Bentz moved to close public hearing 2020-28, Perry seconded. Ayes: 5.

4. PH 2020-29. Mayor Lorenz announced that this is the time and place for a public hearing on the matter of the adoption of plans, specifications, form of contract and estimate of cost for construction of certain public improvements described in general as construction of the Ankeny Parks Maintenance Facility Renovation – Phase 1 project. Notice of this hearing was published in the Des Moines Register on the 10th day of April 2020.

Paul Moritz, Assistant City Manager, reported that the Ankeny Parks Maintenance Facility Renovation - Phase 1 project includes the construction of a 50x80 engineered metal building addition with wash bay at the west end of the existing Ankeny Parks Maintenance Facility. Scope of work includes new water and sanitary service to the building, storm water detention, storm sewer, and site paving. MEP work includes interior and exterior lighting, power, technologies, unit heaters, exhaust system, compressed air piping, water heater, sand/oil separator, and connections to existing building. Phase 2 of this project is

planned for the 2021 construction season and will consist of the complete renovation of the existing building.

Mayor Lorenz then asked for any public comment regarding the proposed Ankeny Parks Maintenance Facility Renovation – Phase 1 Project. Hearing no comments, Council Member Walter-Ashby moved to close public hearing 2020-29, Perry seconded. Ayes: 5.

### **ADMINISTRATIVE BUSINESS**

 City Manager David Jones briefed council on a local small business grant program that is being discussed amongst Metro Cities, Polk County, the Greater Des Moines Partnership, and private donations. Jones explained that at this time the investment required from Ankeny is unknown. After discussion council agreed that it would be difficult to commit to the grant program without knowing a solid dollar amount in the uncertain economy caused by COVID-19. They agreed to follow the activity and potentially make a decision on whether Ankeny would invest at a later time.

- Council member Holm asked if staff had noticed a difference with the cardboard drop site at the maintenance facility with an extra Saturday pickup.
