Mayor Mark Holm called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. Council Members Bobbi Bentz, Jeff Perry, Joe Ruddy, Todd Shafer, and Kelly Stearns were in attendance. City Manager David Jones and City Attorney Amy Beattie were also present. Mayor Holm led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### APPROVAL OF AGENDA

1. Council Member Stearns moved, Bentz seconded, to approve and accept the January 3, 2023 agenda as presented. Ayes: 5.

#### **PUBLIC HEARING**

1. PH 2023-01. Mayor Holm announced this is the time and place for a public hearing on the matter of the proposed review of an application for State Revolving Fund (SRF) Loan and to make available to the public the contents of an environmental information document and the City's project plan. The proposed project involves the construction of the S. Ankeny Blvd Transmission Main Project. Notice of this hearing was published in the Des Moines Register on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of December, 2022.

Don Clark, Municipal Utilities Director, reported the S. Ankeny Blvd. Transmission Main Project will be utilizing the State Revolving Fund (SRF) to provide a lower rate of interest. As part of the SRF process, an environmental review is included. The lowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) provided the Environmental Information Document (EID), which summarizes their findings to date. The consultant has provided the Intended Use Plan (IUP) Application as well as the Environmental Review Checklist and pictures. Staff added the project location map. The purpose of this project is to increase water conveyance from High Trestle Trail to the NW Booster Station and to combine the southwest and east pressure zones into one pressure zone. This project is a portion of our transmission main network to provide an improved performance and operation of our water distribution system. This project is still being designed, but the intention is to have it out for bid later this winter, with construction to follow in the spring of 2023.

Mayor Holm then asked for any public comment regarding the proposed project. Hearing no comments, Council Member Stearns moved, Bentz seconded, to close public hearing 2023-01. Ayes: 5.

2. PH 2023-02. Mayor announced this is the time and place for a public hearing on the matter of the adoption of plans, specifications, form of contract, estimate of cost and enhancement of payment for construction of certain public improvements described in general as construction of the NE Delaware Avenue Reconstruction – NE 5<sup>th</sup> Street to 700 feet north of NE 18<sup>th</sup> Street project. Notice of this hearing was published in the Des Moines Register on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of

## December, 2022.

Mark Mueller, Public Works Director, reported the project includes the reconstruction of NE Delaware Avenue from an existing two-lane rural roadway into a new five-lane urban street with dedicated left turn lanes from just north of NE 5<sup>th</sup> Street to just south of the bridge over Fourmile Creek. New traffic signals will be installed at the intersection of NE Delaware Avenue and NE 5<sup>th</sup> Street and at the intersection of NE Delaware Avenue and NE 18<sup>th</sup> Street. The project also includes the addition of left turn lanes on the side streets adjacent to NE Delaware Avenue, along with the addition of dedicated right turn lanes at all four legs of the NE Delaware Avenue and NE 18<sup>th</sup> Street intersection. A portion of this project is being funded with Federal-aid Swap funds; therefore, the project was bid through the lowa Department of Transportation (DOT).

Mayor Holm then asked for any public comment regarding the proposed project. Hearing no comments, Council Member Bentz moved, Shafer seconded, to close public hearing 2023-02. Aves: 5.
